## RABBI'S REFLECTIONS

How do we decide between two competing opinions? Assume each side is intelligent, welleducated, and well-intentioned. Assume we have examined each argument, and find each has a sound basis in the facts. How do we choose whose opinion to follow? Do we toss a coin? The sages didn't think so. They did, however, offer us a way to move forward. In the Babylonian Talmud, in the Tractate of Eruvin we learn:

Rabbi Abba said in the name of Samuel: "For
 three years, the House of Hillel and the House of Shammai argued. One said, 'The halakha (Jewish practice) is like us,' and the other said, 'The halakha is like us.' A heavenly voice spoke: "Both these and those are the words of the Living God, but the halakha is like the House of Hillel." A question was raised: Since the heavenly voice declared: "Both these and those are the words of the Living God," why was the halakha established to follow the opinion of Hillel? It is because the students of Hillel were kind and gracious. They taught their own ideas as well as the ideas from the students of Shammai. Not only for this reason, but they went so far as to teach Shammai's opinions first."

One of the most important lessons which I learned, while in rabbinical school, is that the way in which we present our point of view may actually be more important than the content of our opinions. We may be far smarter than the person with whom we are disagreeing (or think we are), but if we do not present our argument in a respectful way, or behave in a respectful manner, our sages teach us that our
 point of view should not rule the day. At one point, education, cleverness, even devotion, are no longer sufficient criteria to make a decision.

This is a fascinating teaching coming from sages who achieved their positions through intellectual prowess. Our sages recognize that education and academic achievement are important, but not sufficient. We all need to behave like "menschen," like respectful adults.

May we all take their teaching to heart.
