RABBI'S REFLECTIONS

While the Passover Seder marks the beginning of our journey as a free people, it is the holiday of Shavuot that marks our acceptance of this status. On Shavuot, we commemorate the occasion on which we assumed responsibility for the freedom we've been given. This is the moment when we accepted the Torah.

At Mount Sinai we received our mission statement. It was not enough just to escape Pharaoh, and then flee into the wild. Freedom is not about "everything goes," but about responsibilities; it is about entering into covenants, and forming responsible relationships.

On the second Seder night, we begin a sacred counting, of Sefirat HaOmer. We begin to count the 50 days that lead from freedom at the shore of the Sea of Reeds to the moment we received the Torah at Mount Sinai. Traditionally, each day we say a blessing and count one more day. This practice offers us time to reflect on what it means to be free.

When Shavuot arrives, we are asked to recommit ourselves to the covenant we have with Torah, with each other, with the larger communities of which we are part, with the Jewish people as a whole, with the human race, and with the natural world in which we live, and which needs our efforts to safe-guard it. Acceptance of the Torah involves all these relationships. As we count the Omer to Shavuot, let us consider: how will we live up to our responsibilities as free people?

Here are a bunch of reasons to throw a party and get out to join the fun:

Lag B'Omer on May 9

What is Lag B' Omer? Lag B'Omer is the 33rd day of counting the Omer, the 49-day period between Passover and Shavuot. "Lag" in Hebrew is the number 33. The Omer is a time of semi-mourning when weddings and other celebrations are forbidden, and as a sign of grief, observant Jews do not cut their hair. We learn in the Talmud that during this season, a plague killed thousands of Rabbi Akiva's students because they did not treat each other respectfully. The mourning behavior is presumably in memory of those students and their punishment. According to a medieval tradition, the plague ceased on Lag B'Omer, the 33rd day of the Omer. As a result, Lag B'Omer became a happy day, interrupting the sadness of the Omer period for 24 hours. We listen to music and enjoy the season by celebrating outdoors.

Yom Yerushalayim commemorates the reunification of Jerusalem and the establishment of Israeli control over the Old City after the six-day war against the Jordanian forces in 1967. The day is marked with different events such as recitations of the Hallel prayer in Synagogues, lectures on the history of Jerusalem, street parades, parties, state ceremonies, and memorial services for those that died in the six-day war.

At the FJCC, on May 18 th we will celebrate with a virtual tour of the city of Jerusalem by Israeli tour guide, Joel Haber, a New Jersey native. He will talk about the history of the city, entice us with the tastes and smells of the bustling marketplace, and highlight some of the important tourist sites.
