RABBI'S REFLECTIONS

Chanukkah is upon us, and it could not have come sooner, or at a more opportune time. Chanukkah is all about lighting candles in the darkness, and there is so much darkness in the world right now. I am inspired by Chanukkah. It is the holiday when we are called upon to show hope in the face of despair.

One little light, kindled by an individual, can indeed make a difference when we all join together. This is so beautifully illustrated at our Chanukkah gatherings. We gather in Schul, turn out all the lights, and everyone lights a Menorah. The action of one is magnified by the action of many. And we need as much light as we can make.

We do see glimmers of hope – hostages are being released. But, things in the Middle East change quickly, and I am not certain what the state of affairs will be when this essay reaches you. Will we be on the path to a sustainable peace, or at least, to a sustainable cease-fire? As I write these sentences, I pray that this will be the case.

A story from the Talmud (the Tractate Avodah Zarah):

“Our Rabbis taught: When primitive Adam saw the day getting gradually shorter [in the month of Kislev], he said, 'Woe is me, perhaps because I have sinned (having eaten from the Tree of Knowledge), the world around me is being darkened, and returning to its state of chaos and confusion...!'”



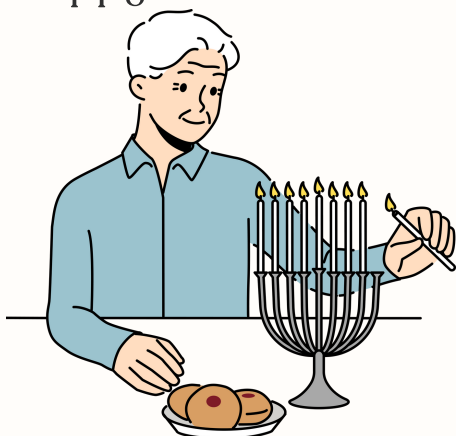
RABBI'S REFLECTIONS

So he began keeping an eight days' fast. But, as he observed the winter equinox, and noted the day getting increasingly longer, he said, 'This is just the way the world is', and he set forth to keep an eight days' festivity..."

"This is just the way the world is." The world throws darkness at us, and it's our job to light it up, as best as we can. This is very hard to do in the face of heinous, murderous acts. And, this idea of battling darkness with light, might seem, perhaps, counter-intuitive: the way to fight darkness is not with more darkness, it is with light.

Fighting the forces of darkness with more darkness, may be a temporary strategy, but it is not an answer. This does not mean we do not defend ourselves; it means that defending ourselves, fighting back, is not the goal, it is a means. As we send material and moral support to those on the front lines of defending the Holy Land, let us remember that this is a means to an end. A very important means! But not the final objective. The end goal is a just and lasting resolution to a conflict that has been escalating over generations. May this Chanukkah inspire us to light a path forward, into a better future, and may we start taking the necessary steps to achieve it, soon, and in our time.

Happy Chanukkah to one and all!



FROM THE DESK OF OUR PRESIDENT



Dear Members:

Over the past few months, I gathered with a dozen Israeli friends and witnessed the horror of October 7th. I listened to hours of news about the crisis in Israel and Gaza, I attended the rally in Washington in support of Israel, and I commiserated with visiting Israelis who worry for their relatives. The most important thing I learned – we need to educate ourselves about Israeli history and all facets of this war and constantly pass on accurate information to family, friends, Jews, non-Jews, the public, etc.

After over 40 days of the Israel-Hamas war, the Jewish community in the United States and Israel is confronted with many needs for your ongoing help. Among them:

- Keep our community members safe from harm,
- Care for our own and our children's emotional well-being,
- Educate ourselves and our neighbors on the history of the State of Israel and the conflict,
- Contact our Senators/Representatives daily to thank them for their support,
- Contribute to Israeli causes of your choice,
- Stand up and support Israel.

To this end, the FJCC is 1) coordinating with our Security Committee, security advisors and the local police, 2) initiating small group sessions, led by Rabbi Cohen, to connect with each other, 3) creating educational opportunities and passing along educational videos, 4) asking each of our members to regularly contact your elected officials and 5) providing options for your contributions.

MST GATHERING

On Thursday, November 9, John Fellin, Bruce Moskovitz, and Sharon Rednor represented the Flemington Jewish Community Center at the Memorial Scrolls Trust (MST) Gathering at Congregation Rodeph Shalom in Philadelphia. We brought our Holocaust Torah to be displayed along with approximately 50 other Holocaust Torahs during a program in remembrance of Kristallnacht, the Night of Broken Glass. Mr. Jeffrey Ohrenstein, the MST Trustee and Chairman, gave a very moving talk on "The Power of the Czech Torah Scrolls in Jewish Life."



The MST was created to care for the damaged and deteriorating Torah scrolls that were initially housed in the Jewish Museum of Prague after the Nazis invaded Bohemia and Prague and subsequently transferred to an abandoned and ruined temple outside Prague when the Communists took over the country's government in 1948.

These Torah scrolls, dating from 1200 up to World War II, were brought to London and donated to the Westminster Synagogue in 1964. The MST cared for these Torahs and made them available on

loan to congregations, schools, and organizations worldwide.



The Flemington Jewish Community Center was honored to receive one of these Torahs on April 28, 1989. We have housed this Torah in our ark along with all our other Torahs since that time. And, although the Torah is posul (not kosher; invalid for official purposes), we lovingly continue to use this Torah for Simchat Torah celebrations and Yom Kippur when all our sifrei Torah are removed from the ark.

HEBREW SCHOOL

Shabbat is a reoccurring theme in all our Hebrew School Classes. The Gimel - Vau students are busy learning prayers for Shabbat Services. The Gimel through Hebrew High Students have led Friday Night Services; and the Gimel through Vau students will lead two more services in the coming months. The Alef-Bet students are making their own Shabbat Boxes that include Shabbat candle holders and candles, Kiddush cup, and Challah Cover and Tzedakah box. The Gan students learned about Shabbat with Mrs. Clarin and assistant Rose Weitz last month. We are learning about Chanukah, the stories, the traditions, the brachot and songs.



240 Menorahs for Chanukah Dinner

On October 7th 240 hostages were taken by Hamas. from southern Israel. Let's show our support and our hopes for their physical and metal recovery by lighting 240 Menorahs. Bring as many menorahs as you have to the Chanukah dinner. On December 13. We will light them together with prayers for peace and the safe return home of all the hostages.



AT HOME IN HUNTERDON

Our Ukrainian family arrived on 11/16/23 as expected. We gave them a tour of Flemington and a small welcome party at the home of Melissa Kleiman. Shortly after their arrival they visited with friends in Jersey City and came to the realization that they would be more comfortable living in a city type setting instead of out in the country. This family has since made arrangements to live in Jersey City and is no longer in need of our support. With this turn of events, our Welcome Circle has made a decision to move forward with sponsoring another family waiting in a refugee camp for the opportunity to reside in the US. We feel success in having gotten a family out of war-torn Ukraine into safety in the United States and look forward to the opportunity to help out a second family with the donations that have been collected.

Our mission is to provide a home and safety for those suffering in their own countries and looking to settle in the U.S. At this time, it has not been determined from which country we will be matched with a family, but we are prepared to support all cultures from around the world. In addition to the funds we have raised, we have also collected furniture and other household items which will be stored until a new family has been scheduled to arrive in the US and a new apartment has been rented. Your understanding and support of this sensitive situation is very much appreciated. At this time of Thanksgiving, we are incredibly thankful for all of you and to be part of such a giving and supportive community. Have a wonderful holiday season.
