# RABBI'S REFLECTIONS

As I write these words for our synagogue bulletin, I am listening to news about bombs dropping in Gaza, and families begging for news about their kidnapped loved ones. It is really hard to hear all this. What is our responsibility, we, who sit thousands of miles away from this death and suffering?

First, we must remember that the real suffering, despite all our anxiety, lost sleep and grief, is nowhere near us. Our focus must be on those in need. We should be donating to organizations who are there, on the ground, helping. To that end, there are a number of links in the News & Notes emails that will lead you to organizations who desperately need your help. Second, we must remember that we are not fighting this battle in the Near East. It does no one any good to demonize those here, with whom we have strong disagreements. Vigils, rallies, letters, yes! But, when we take things too far, 9-year-old Palestinian boys are murdered (as has happened outside Chicago). Third, in addition to the material support which we donate, we should check in on each other. Who has friends, loved ones, relatives in Israel? When was the last time we checked in with them? Pick up that phone! Fourth, our Muslim neighbors are becoming (if they have not been already) targets of extremists and racists in our midst.



# RABBI'S REFLECTIONS

What eludes Israelis and Palestinians in Israel, the West Bank, and Gaza, does not have to elude us. Building bridges is a powerful response to violence and hatred.

Finally, never underestimate the power of prayer. Prayer may not change the hearts of haters and murderers, but it is an effective balm for our broken spirits. In calling out to God, to the universe, with our despair and pain, we lift our emotions upwards, we elevate them. Calling out our needs, our fears, giving voice to them, gives them over to God. We are never alone in our suffering. There is always someone hurting with us, who cares, who sympathizes, who will not abandon us. But..., we must reach out. As the Psalm teaches: "From the depths I call out to you, God, hear me...!" I firmly believe that God DOES hear us. And, if we listen very carefully, if we don't allow ourselves to be distracted, I think we can sense a response. And, for me, that is the source of all hope.

For all those who have been wounded and kidnapped, may they experience healing and redemption, speedily and soon, and may the killing end just as quickly. Amen.

What a difference a week makes! Last week, as I was drafting my message, I was writing about how beautiful it was to spend the High Holidays together. And it was! Now, a week after the brutal attacks of Israelis by Hamas terrorists, my message took a turn.

The Flemington Jewish Community Center and our members continue to show support of Israel. These demonstrations of solidarity are so important! Thank you. I spent my vacation last week visiting with ten Israeli friends (who are working in the US) and they were so grateful for every gesture – a phone call asking about their safety, a solidarity shout-out “Am Yisrael Chai” which literally translated means ‘the people of Israel live,’ or a brief hug for someone grieving. As the situation in Israel changes from one of surprise and mourning to resolve, unity and strength the needs change. Please continue to help by attending Jewish institutions, contributing to relief efforts and thanking those who support Israel.

In comforting our community and demonstrating our beliefs, the FJCC will continue to offer religious services and activities. - If we provide food choices and offer fresh produce, attractively displayed in lovely baskets for clients to "shop" themselves, some grown in our own garden, it would be enough. If we offer fresh produce and deliver food orders to people with medical issues or those unable to come to the pantry, it would be enough.
- If we deliver food to those unable to come to the pantry and provide a special senior food pantry day with lunch, and do deliveries for seniors, it would be enough.
- If we provide a senior pantry day with lunch, do deliveries for seniors, and provide birthday bags to children ages 3-12, it would be enough.
- If we provide birthday bags to children and diapers, incontinence products, feminine hygiene products, personal care items and reading glasses, it would be enough.
- If we provide diapers, incontinence products, feminine hygiene products, personal care items, reading glasses and selected items appropriate for people living in motels, it would be enough.
- If we provide selected items appropriate for people living in motels, and stock little food pantries for times when the pantry is closed, it would be enough.
- If we stock little food pantries, and educate people about our pantry, it would be enough.




