RABBI'S REFLECTIONS

Chanukah is the holiday of lights, though it comes at the darkest season of the year. It is also a remembrance of an historic struggle. Perhaps, the timing and history of this holiday is meant to call us to action: if we want light in this world, WE must light it. And, this year of all years, we need to do all we can to bring in more light.

Rabbi Amy Eilberg, the first woman to be ordained a Conservative rabbi, warns that the norms of decency, core principles of Jewish ethics and truth itself are all under attack in today's America. Chanukah, she suggests, was meant for times such as these. We were taught in Hebrew school that Chanukah was about Judah the Maccabee defeating the Syrian-Greeks. True! But, our tradition offers a parallel narrative:

"Our Rabbis taught: When primitive Adam saw the day getting gradually shorter [in the month of Kislev], he said, 'Woe is me, perhaps because I have sinned (having eaten from the Tree of Knowledge), the world around me is being darkened and returning to its state of chaos and confusion...!' So, he began keeping an eight days' fast. But as he observed the winter equinox and noted the day getting increasingly longer, he said, 'This is just the way the world is', and he set forth to keep an eight days' festivity..." (Babylonian Talmud, Tractate, Avodah Zarah).

This year, it feels right to focus on this aspect of Chanukah. One that connects us to the rest of humanity (so many of the nations who are Adam's and Eve's descendants have holidays at this time), but one that also supports the Jewish community in particular.

As we look forward to Chanukah, we cannot avoid feeling the pain of our times. Rabbi Eilberg encourages us: when the world around us grows dark, we are tasked with lighting it up to soothe and lift our spirits, and to connect ourselves with the Divine around and within us. She offers the sight of the Chanukkiah as precisely the source of inspiration we need in these times. An eight-candle version of the Menorah, it moves from faint light to a blaze of eight (really, nine with the shamash) beautiful candles. May this light nourish us. May it empower us to renew our commitment to work for justice here, in Israel, and wherever we are tasked with shining light in the darkness. A joyous Chanukah to one and all!




HEBREW SCHOOL
