RABBI'S REFLECTIONS

We are always in the process of learning. Hopefully, a good deal of that is Torah learning. My colleague, Rabbi Avi Strassberg of Yeshivat Hadar, asks: to what extent does our Torah learning make an impact on our actions? Remember, we finish the High Holy Days, during which we commit to behaving better in the new year, to striving toward a more righteous way of living. Are we actually better people as a result of our Torah study? Or, are we basically the same, with maybe a bit more learning under our belts?

In his teaching on Parashat Bereishit, in his great work, the Eish Kodesh, R. Kalonymous Kalman Shapira writes: “A person who learns Torah, but is not transformed thereby into Torah and holiness, is merely a bookshelf containing books—they remain merely a piece of wood, as they were before.”

Torah learning is not just an end in itself. Rather, the goal of learning Torah is nothing less than to transform our very selves into Torah and into holiness. As Rabbi Strassberg explains: it's not just that we are people who sometimes perform holy actions; rather, in our essence, we embody holiness with every breath, every choice, every interaction.

Indeed, our Sages teach, again in Pirkei Avot: “Study is not the most important thing, but rather action is...” Rabbi Natan Zvi Finkel who lived in the 19th century, adds: “The meaning of this is not that without action, study is not central, but rather without action, there is no value to Torah at all... We are obligated to mold ourselves through action, meaning to change our existence to one of holiness, through keeping mitzvot.”

The Torah is called the Tree of Life. Both trees and bookcases are made of wood. Trees are living, growing creatures. Bookcases are useful and convenient, but it is what they hold that matters the most. We can all become bookcases to one extent or another. We can spend time learning, and achieve, intellectually, what we are capable of achieving. But... can we become Torah? Can we transform ourselves with the learning we do? As we begin this New Year, I pray that I am able to do so. I hope you will join me. Shanah Tovah!

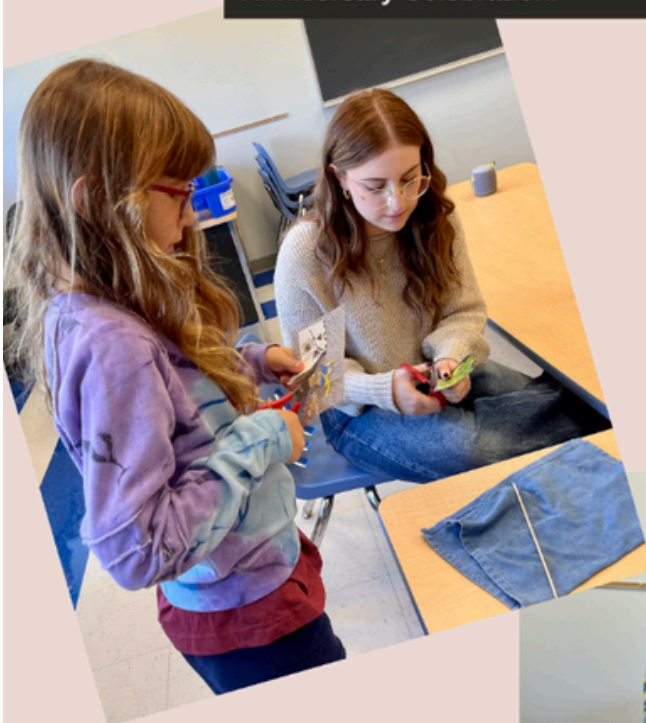

FJCC GIVING GARDEN



"When you are asked in the world to come, "What was your work?" and you answer, "I fed the hungry," you will be told, "This is the gate of Adonai, enter into it, you who have fed the hungry."" (Midrash to Psalm 118:17)

The Torah and Jewish tradition are explicit in commanding that we feed the hungry. It's a particularly amazing feeling contributing to the FJCC's part in this very important mitzvah. Believe it or not, this summer was the TENTH season of our Giving Garden!!! Ten years ago our garden was built with six beds. Today we have thirteen. Just one year ago we hand-watered every bed nearly every non-raining day. This year we have a dripline and hand water infrequently. We've had good seasons and poor seasons but this summer we have had a SPECTACULAR yield!!! And every bit of the vegetables and herbs grown were donated to the Flemington Food Pantry. It is likely we will still be delivering through the High Holidays.

Grown this year were: Basil, beets, bell peppers, butternut squash, celery, cherry tomatoes, cucumbers, eggplant, hot peppers, kale, lettuce, okra, oregano, parsley, peas, potatoes, string beans, tomatoes, watermelon and zucchini. While the basil, beans, okra, lettuce, peppers and tomatoes were in abundance, the beets, kale and eggplants didn't grow well. The watermelon and zucchini plants died early. And the lawn care guys weed-whacked through the butternut squash vines. So our success came with some failures, but we continue to learn, make adjustments and will do better next year.



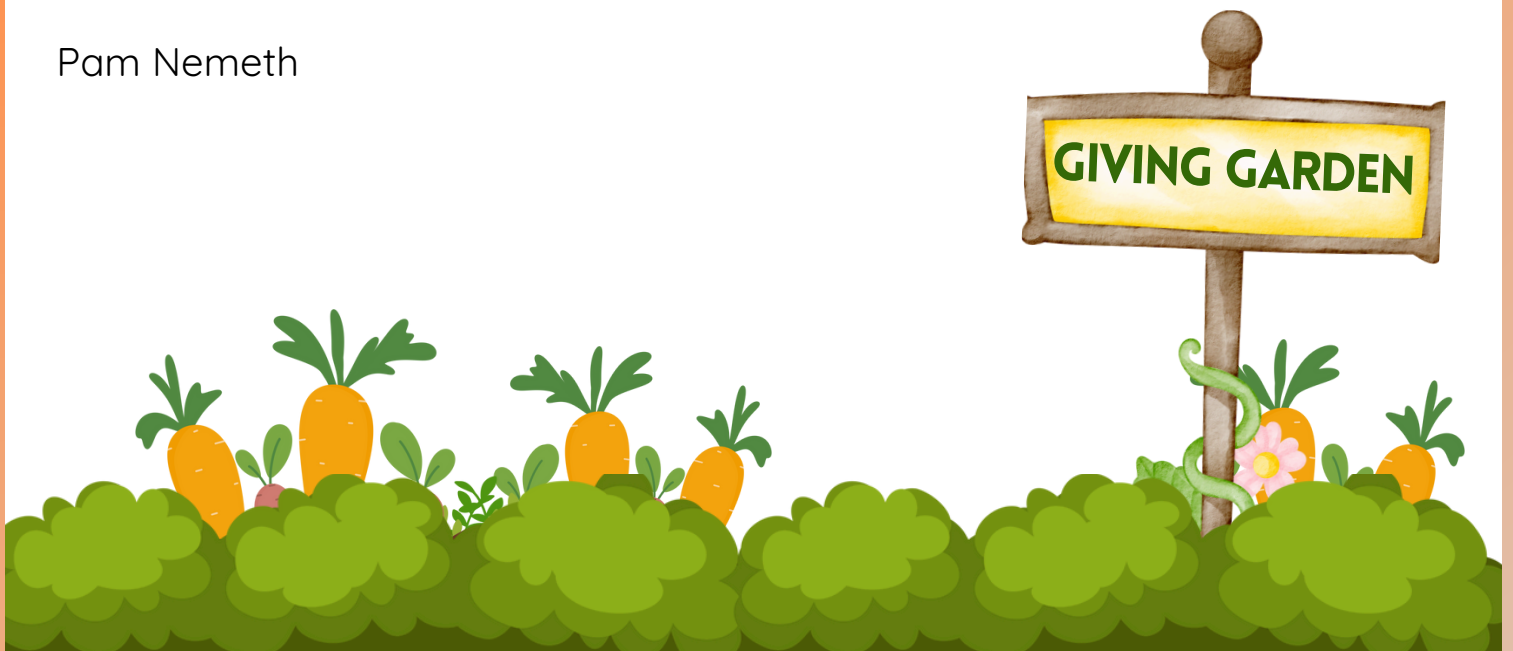
Without the need for near daily hand watering, far fewer volunteers were called upon. But volunteers are essential for getting the beds ready, planting, improvements and repairs. I am grateful to everyone who contributed your time, labor, plants and growing prowess. And also to those who made a donation during our first ever take a plant home fundraiser, and to our community partners who donated soil, plants and supplies.

Next year at this very time I will be quite pre-occupied with the wedding of my son, Zachary, and will not be able to do all that is required prior to planting. In order for our garden to continue someone/s will need to take on the responsibilities. If a few people divide the tasks we can continue doing our beautiful mitzva and also have a brilliant eleventh season.



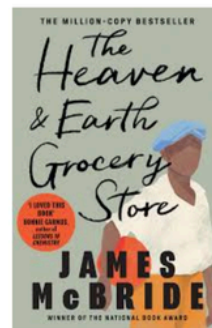
