Rabbi's Reflections

This year, later in May, we will celebrate Shavuot. It is one of the three pilgrimage holidays commanded in the Torah. Shavuot means 'weeks' in Hebrew, and marks the conclusion of the Counting of the Omer. Its date is directly linked to that of Passover; the Torah mandates the seven-week Counting of the Omer, beginning on the second day of Passover, to be immediately followed by Shavuot. This counting of days and weeks is understood to express anticipation and desire for the giving of the Torah. On Passover, the people of Israel were freed from their enslavement to Pharaoh; on Shavuot, they were given the Torah, and became a nation committed to serving God.

Rabbi Isaac Meir of Gur (a 19th century CE Hasidic master) teaches: "Why is the holiday of Shavuot called "the time of giving the Torah," and not "the time of receiving the Torah?" Because, he answers, the giving of Torah was at Mount Sinai, but the receiving of Torah can happen each and every day...". Indeed, we learn in Pirkei Avot (Ethics of Our Fathers 6:2): "Rabbi Yehoshua Ben Levi says (second-third century CE): 'Everyday a voice goes out from Mount Sinai calling us to Torah...'



The Ba'al Shem Tov (the founder of Hasidism, 18th century) comments on this teaching: "If there is a voice coming out every day from Mount Sinai, then why don't we hear it? And, if we don't hear it, why bother to have a voice come out at all?" He answers: "Every time a person is inspired to better themselves, it is because they are, in fact, hearing that voice. Every time that we are struck with an unexpected thought that pushes us in the right direction--unexpected because it is totally out of character for us, and a complete departure from our present frame of mind--that means that our inner ear has picked up the Divine voice calling from Mount Sinai."

What a fascinating lesson! We hear the voice from Sinai, the very voice our ancestors heard. Perhaps, we don't experience the thunder, lightning, or smoke that they did. But, we can experience the personal, transformative moments that move us to reach for something higher.

On this Shavuot, let us all take some time to listen carefully: what is that voice from Sinai calling us to do? May we merit hearing that voice, and finding the courage to follow it.

From Our President

Tolerance is often defined as the willingness to accept beliefs, practices, or perspectives that differ from our own, and it is a value we hold dear in our community.

We take pride in being a community that embraces differences in sexual orientation, skin color, identity, race and life experiences. These commitments reflect our deepest values and strengthen who we are. But if we are truly committed to being an inclusive and welcoming congregation, we must ask ourselves: can we extend that same openness to differences in thought, perspective, and even political affiliation? Can we ensure that our community remains a place where people feel safe not only for who they are, but also for what they believe?

I believe most people see themselves as open-minded, respectful, and welcoming—but it is worth asking ourselves: how tolerant are we, really?

It is relatively easy to be tolerant when differences are minor or when others' views do not challenge us. The real test comes when we encounter ideas that run counter to our own deeply held beliefs. In those moments, tolerance can give way to anger, dismissal and rejection. We may begin to question not just the idea, but the person who holds it.

I find myself increasingly concerned that, as a society, we are becoming less tolerant in precisely these moments. Too often, when different perspectives are raised—especially on issues that matter deeply—relationships are strained and even permanently damaged. I have seen, and at times experienced how simply expressing a different point of view creates distance between people who otherwise care deeply about one another.

In a congregation, where community and shared purpose matter so deeply, this challenge is even more important. If we only feel comfortable with those who think as we do, we risk narrowing the very community we seek to build. True tolerance does not require agreement. It asks something more difficult: that we listen with respect, speak with care, and remain connected even in the presence of disagreement.

Our tradition teaches the value of engaging with differing perspectives, not turning away from them. Jewish learning is built on discussion, debate, and the respectful exchange of ideas. It reminds us of that disagreement, when approached with humility and care, is not something to fear, but something that can deepen both our understanding and our relationships.

A strong congregation is not one without differences, but one that has the courage and compassion to hold them. In doing so, we not only preserve our relationships—we strengthen them.

Shabbat Lunch & Learn

After services on February 21 our members gathered for a Lunch and Learn led by Pam Nemeth. Pam shared with us the history of the Slave Castles of Ghana that she and her husband Jonathan toured on their trip to Africa. She spoke about the dungeons where African people were held before those that survived were shipped off to slavery. This was an aspect of slavery that most of our congregants didn't know much about and appreciated the lessons and pictures shared by Pam.

On February 28 we had a Lunch and Learn in celebration of the 20th Anniversary of our congregation's current building. Members of the former FJCC Building Committee, including Greg Scibilia, Ron Jampel, and former president Jeff Doshna, shared stories about all the work and decision making that went into the construction of the building we now know as home. The presenters even told stories of the times plans didn't always go as expected. In addition, there was a table full of newspaper clippings, documents, and pictures on display for everyone to view.

On March 7 Josh Wilk, Yiddishist and FJCC Hebrew School Alumnus led a Shabbat Lunch and Learn where he gave a brief discussion about the Yiddish language and taught the group a few Yiddish words and expressions. Josh has now formed a class for those interested in learning more about Yiddish. The class meets every Tuesday at 6:30 pm. Anyone interested in joining the group can reach out to Rabbi Cohen.

On Saturday, March 21 congregants participated in Shabbat Beyachad and after services they attended a Pre-Passover Lunch and Learn led by Rabbi Cohen on the topic of Kitniyot. The Rabbi explained why some Jewish people eat rice and beans on Passover and others don't. This led to additional conversations about other family traditions people have for Passover. Prior to this event people were asked to bring rice, beans, cooking oil, and diapers to be donated to Harbor of Hope.

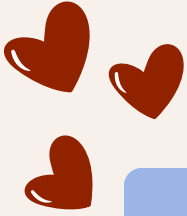
